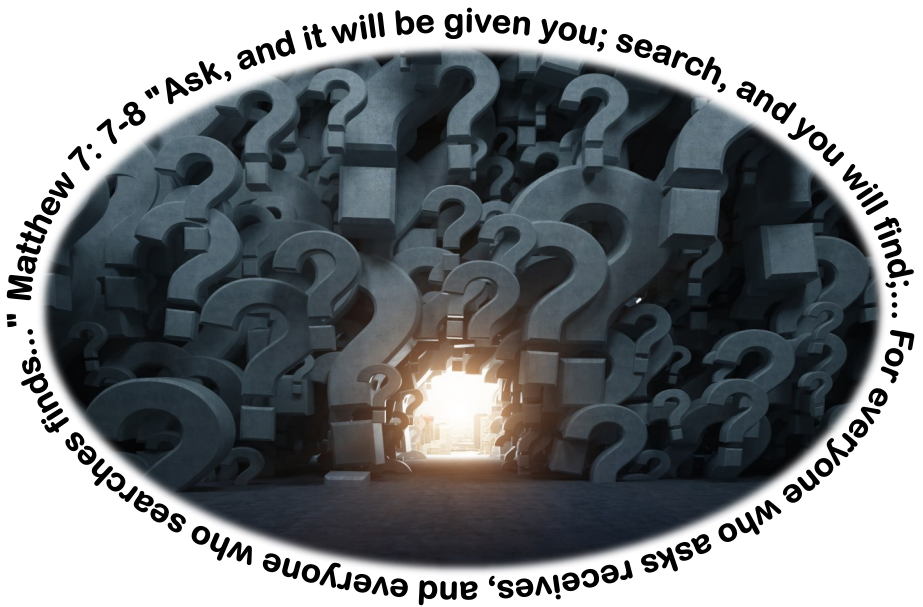

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month Joy Williams asks...



'What is Epiphany?'

Well, let's start by asking what the word means. The Cambridge dictionary offers two definitions:

- 1) A Christian holy day in January (traditionally 6 January in Western Christianity) that celebrates the revelation of the baby Jesus to the world. (St. Matthew 2:1-12 The Magi visit Jesus)
- 2) A moment when you suddenly feel that you understand, or suddenly become conscious of, something that is very important to you. (Ephesians 2 & 3)

How much we need God's Epiphany moments in these difficult times.

Every new year brings us closer to Jesus' return and the battling in the heavenly realms between good and evil gets fiercer. This is reflected on the earth in general and in our everyday lives too. Fear can threaten to overwhelm us. Our faith and trust in God's love and care is really tested as we look around at what is happening in the world – cruel wars, shortages, climate change, hunger, cost of living increases, health and care services creaking, illegal immigration and the refugee situation seemingly overwhelming. Is God really the loving Father we thought he was? Wouldn't he stop it if he was?

How do you react to all this?

Do you ask the same question or do you ask God to show you why this is happening?

Do you ask him to remind you of the promises he has made to those who trust him?

Do you go to your Bibles for answers and/or reflect on both the wider picture and the personal ones in the light of what the Holy Spirit brings to your attention?

Do you ask him what you can do that will help to alleviate the suffering, further his plan and to hasten Jesus' return to the earth?

Battles between good and evil continue but Jesus has already won the

war. Through his life, death, resurrection and ascension he has conquered sin and death. We are called to enforce the victory by the way we live our lives – loving God and loving our neighbours. We could start by joining our prayers with those of the angels using St, Paul’s words to help us.

So, let us pray this prayer of St Paul regularly for ourselves, for others and those who hold positions of authority under God in this world.

Prayer based on Ephesians 3:14-20 (make it personal/for others/for the church):

I kneel before you Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of your glorious riches you may strengthen [me/a name/the church] with power through your Spirit in [my/your/their] inner being, so that Christ may dwell in [my heart/their heart(s)] through faith. And I pray that [I/you/they], being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord’s holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that [I/you/they] may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever!

Amen

Items needed: Coffee, Cooking Sauces, Deodorant, Hot Chocolate, Household Cleaning Products, Long Life Fruit Juice, Powdered Milk, Savoury Spreads (Marmite, Peanut Butter, Meat Paste etc.), Shower Gel, Sweet Spreads (Jam, Marmalade etc.), Tampons, Tinned Meat (Hot, e.g. Chilli, Hot Dogs, Stewing Steak), Tinned Veg.

Please **do not** give Baby Food, Hand Soap, Hot & Cold Cereal, Men's Shampoo, Non-Dairy Milk, Pasta, Pet Food, Pulses, Rice, Sanitary Pads, Tea, Tinned Beans, Tinned Rice Pudding, Tinned Soup, as these are already in surplus.
