The Sanctuary

The dais carpet is beginning to show its age, and like most of us of a certain age it has developed wrinkles. We have had the carpet stretched and cleaned, while still not perfect, it is better than it was. In addition to the carpet, all the chairs in the Sanctuary have also been cleaned.

In order to maintain the carpet and chairs in as good a condition, and for as long as possible, may I remind you that any equipment or furniture on the dais must be lifted when moved and not dragged, as this is believed to have been the main cause of the wrinkles. If you move a chair put it back where you found it. The chairs lock together and each has a place.

Do not take food or drink, other than fresh water to drink, into the Sanctuary. Thank you.

Flooding of the Concourse

On the afternoon of Sunday 11th June we had a torrential thunder storm resulting in water pouring through the concourse roof and down the stairs from the first floor into the concourse. This resulted in 2 inches of water in the concourse at the London Street entrance with a shallow amount reaching as far as the kitchen. The water impacted not only on the electrics but also the fire alarm system. Two firms were commissioned to examine the electrics and fire alarm system. On Tuesday 13th June we had the 8th Basingstoke Scouts in the building. The fire alarm went off, children and leaders evacuated the building and the fire brigade called. After an inspection of the building no fire was found but they stated that water had penetrated the smoke detectors in the concourse which trigged the alarm. The alarm was reset with a verbal demand given that the alarm system be thoroughly inspected.

There are numerous faults with the electrics and we will have to close the building over a 5 day period for the work to be carried out. Porton Fire Services who carried out the inspection of the fire alarm system have found that the system is old and obsolete and it would not be possible to source replacement parts and the recommendation is to replace it. An analogue system will take up to 5 weeks to install and test. The Trustees are also looking at a wireless system which won't have the same impact on the fabric of the building and will be quicker to install.

As I write this article, I have engaged a competent person to undertake a fire safety risk assessment to advise on the fire alarm systems and check that the reports and quotes given for the work against the reports are adequate. I have also contacted our insurance provider for the building to ensure that we have the correct level of cover provided by a fire alarm, and a statement pertaining to the level of fire protection they would require us to have I can forward to a fire alarm installer. 


COMMUNITY COOKBOOK

Jean Young shares a recipe for a delicious treat you may have enjoyed recently after a Sunday service.

LEMON/ORANGE/LIME CRISP BISCUITS

Makes: 20 approx.



INGREDIENTS:

125g/4oz. Butter or soft margarine.

50g/2oz. Caster sugar (and a little extra to sprinkle on top).

150g/5oz Self raising flour.

Grated rind of one lemon, orange, or lime.

METHOD:

1. Pre-heat oven to 180C/350F/Gas mark 4. Grease or line a couple of baking trays, and have wire trays or racks ready to cool them on.

2. Rub the butter or soft margarine into the other ingredients until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.

3. Work the mixture into a dough.

4. Roll into small balls about 2.5cm/1 inch in diameter, or roll out dough and use a biscuit cutter.

5. Put them 5cm/2 inches apart on the prepared baking trays.

6. Flatten the balls of dough with a fork dipped in cold water.

7. Bake above the middle of a moderate oven as above, for about 10-12 minutes until pale gold in colour.

8. Allow to cool slightly before moving them to wire trays or racks to cool completely. Sprinkle with the extra caster sugar while still hot.
