Scientists from the University of Manchester have calculated that the typical family barbecue (cheeseburgers, strawberries & cream) releases as much CO2 into the atmosphere as a 90 mile car trip. It's the burger that's the main culprit -- barbecuing produces CO2, producing grain to make the bun and feed the cattle (which also belch methane) sends out more CO2. Swapping chicken for the burger would bring emissions down to an equivalent 51-mile drive or swapping to veggie sausages and skipping the cheese and cream down to 33 miles.

#### A SUMMER OF SPORT

Rev. Josh Thomas looks at the lessons we can learn as we watch our sporting heroes.

You all know me well enough to know that I love nothing more than the summer season. The shorts come out, the BBQ gets lit as frequently as possible, and we all enjoy a little bit more, the beauty of God's creation. I must confess a preference

to an even year in the calendar though, why? Because of all the sport of course!

I write this article at the very start of the EUROs, and full of optimism! Just last night I watched England rise victorious against Serbia and marvelled at just what a player Jude Bellingham already is aged just 20 years old. Of course, sadly if you follow Scotland, things aren't looking quite so rosy... when the EUROs are over and hopefully England have 'brought it home', we look towards Wimbledon and the great spectacle of that fortnight, showcasing everything we love about Britain... and then, yes, and then! It is also an Olympic and Paralympic year on top of it all. If you can't find me in the next few months, it's probably because I'm glued to the television!






