THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month, Alison Jamieson explores the uplifting impact of a chance encounter.

Last week I was just about to leave the church after a morning in the kitchen, everyone else had left, and as I walked down the concourse, I saw a couple who had been looking in the greenhouse bread store and then moved round to look at the church notice board.

I went out, ready to lock up, but turned to them and enquired if there was anything I could help them with, as they were busy still looking at the notice board. They smiled and explained what they wanted to know, in rather halting English.

They said they were Brazilian and attended the Gateway Church. He is a musician there. They had discovered the old 'Winslade Chapel', which is out in the country and was a sister chapel to London St., it has been deconsecrated and is now used as storage by a farmer. They were wanting to be able to go and play music out there, I think praise music, and wanted to know who owned it now. I thought Joy Williams would know more of the history and so I have put them in touch with her.

The next day Leng Ayland told me that when she was putting the Greenhouse bread store out a lady came to talk to her. She worked at a shop out in Popley. She was concerned that much of their bread was thrown away and, at times, a lot of veg and fruit, as well as groceries. She wanted to know if anyone could pick the food up so that it didn't go to waste. Leng said she would talk to Penny Dilley at CFL, to see how this could be arranged.

It struck me that these were two instances of individuals being in the right place at the right time, where two chance encounters had positive outcomes. They were links in a chain in people's lives.

We read in much of the Gospels of accounts of people coming to Jesus for teaching, to ask him questions, or for requests for healing. There are few accounts of chance meetings with people who don't know who he is. I can think of the widow of Nain (whose son had died and Jesus

raised to life), the lame man at the pool of Bethsaida (whom he healed), and the Samaritan woman at the well (where they had a conversation that changed her life and those of many of the population).

I expect that many of us have had experiences when our paths have crossed with those we do or don't know, and we have been able to give information, provide some practical assistance or advice, and possibly held that person and their circumstances in prayer too.

Some would say they were 'God incidences' not just random coincidences; opportunities to show kindness and attention to folk as we listen and do what we can, and that can't be bad, can it?

Items needed: UHT Milk, Coffee, Cooking Sauces, Custard, Nappies (Size 5 & Above), Powered Milk, Savoury Snacks, Crisps, Sweet Spreads (Jam, Marmalade etc.), Tinned Meat (e.g. Chilli, Stewing Steak, Ham), Tinned Spaghetti/Ravioli, Tinned Tomatoes, Tinned Veg.

Please **do not** give Baby Food, Hand Soap, Cereal, Nappies (Size 4 & Below), Non-Dairy Milk, Pasta, Pet Food, Pulses, Sanitary Pads, Tinned Beans, Tinned Soup, as these are already in surplus.

Any help you can give is particularly gratefully received at this time, to help families struggling without extra support through the summer holidays.




