THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month, Peter Bentall discusses the violence going on across the globe, and its solution.

Psalm 96: 11-12

Let the heavens rejoice; let the earth be glad; let the sea resound; let the fields be jubilant;...then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy.



Suddenly a few days of cloudless blue sky and warm March sunshine and the heavens do indeed rejoice, new life springs from the earth trees and hedgerows burst into bud. A walk through Eastrop or War Memorial Park is all that is needed to lift the spirits. Just about warm enough to sit for a few minutes and thank God once again for winter merging into spring and the evenings getting lighter. Nature in this part of the world is waking up, as beautiful as ever without the help of human hands.

But sadly, this is not the universal picture, as in many parts of the world nature has become more violent, caused certainly in part by some man-made climate change, according to the accepted science, and not easy to control.

Some things though are within human control and yet we seem unable, or in some cases unwilling, to restrain the perpetrators of violence. Ukraine, Syria, Gaza, Yemen, Sudan, are all areas where wanton mass destruction has devasted the lives of some of the poorest people, by a few powerful, personally ambitious, ruthless individuals supplied with the most sophisticated weaponry on the one hand, and old fashioned attritional trench warfare on the other, with little concern for military of civilian life.

As international leaders belatedly try to conjure a solution to these crises the consensus seems to be 'spend more on defence', at the expense of better health and social care, hospitals, and foreign aid. On the one hand, God's creation. On the other, man's destruction (yes man's!), and the answer is not more of the same, the answer is the message of Easter - 'God so loved the world that he gave his Son'. Jesus died, not so that we could bomb each other to death, but for us to be reconciled to God, and embrace the sure and certain hope of eternal life.

Our prayers are needed more than ever this Lent for God's broken world.

Please **do not** give Baby Food, Hot/Cold Cereal, Nappies, Non-Dairy Milk, Pasta, Pulses, Rice, Sanitary Pads, Tinned Beans, as these are already in surplus.
