THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month, Beryl Wootton presents her article entitled 'Immeasurably more!'

'Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the Church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen'.



Ephesians 3: 20-21

I have supported M. A. F. (Mission Aviation Fellowship) since I was 17 years old. They bought their film 'Jungle Pilot' to my home church and I was so inspired by it that even today I can remember almost every detail. I also bought and read the book by the same name, written by Nate Saint.

A long time ago now, but I still find their work stimulating. This is their 80th year and the letter that begins their Prayer Diary (April – June 2025) underlines their attitude to prayer:

'It's very easy to get caught up in the here and now and the cares of today, and lose our heavenly perspective.

When coming to God in prayer, it's imperative that we direct our eyes and hearts heavenwards. When we hear that 1 billion people live in isolation and more than 80% of these are extremely poor, it can feel overwhelming. The need can appear too great.

It's at times like this when I think of Jesus feeding the 5,000 with just 5 loaves and 2 fish. The need was great and what they had in their hands was clearly not enough – a mere drop in the ocean, as it were.

'As evening approached, the disciples came to Him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."

'Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat"

"We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered.

"Bring them here to me," He said. And He directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, He gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then He gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people.

'They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over' (Matthew 14: 15-20).

Jesus was enough!

The above account reminds us that all we need to do is bring what we have to Jesus, fix our eyes on Him and look heavenwards. The God of abundance and 'immeasurably more' is at work. In this diary, the Scriptures on each page recall the mindset from which we're to pray and remind us that the God we serve is a miracle-working God!

Celebrating 80 years of MAF reminds us that God has always provided and has never let us down. This edition of the prayer diary provides a couple of pages that reflect on the importance of prayer to MAF.'

They have included an Audacious Prayer page, sharing some really big faith prayer requests for the coming year.

They thank God that one in every five flights are made possible thanks to gifts in Wills and pray that this continues.

They currently serve 2,500 communities in 533 destinations. With so many living in isolation they pray that they will be able to expand their reach and help reduce this staggering statistic.

MAF has launched a bold environmental policy that focuses on cutting carbon emissions, in proportion to their flying, by 30% by 2035. They ask us to pray that over the next 10 years, they will be successful in their desire to be better stewards of all that God has given them.

This is just a flavour of the prayers they are praying, and asking us to pray for, and believe that He is able to move mountains!

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.


